



WET PALETTE

AK8064

The Wet Palette is a tool mainly used by figure painters, but more and more it is being used by people that paint with acrylics. It will extend the useful life of any acrylic so that it can be used for hours and once shut it will preserve the colors and color mixtures. It can be kept in the fridge. It has three components:

1. Sponge, to hold large quantities of water, since it is quite thick.
2. Cloth made of fiber, placed on top of the sponge as a leveler, humidity filter, and as an interchangeable element in case of stains or if not used for a long time.
3. High quality Special Paper, made of a fine silicone film, allows the transfer of humidity but prevents water forming and paints from dissolving, and does not give off any fibers not hairs when worked with the brushes.

The Wet Palette is watertight and airtight, made of the same material of marine containers for flares, charts, and medicines. Its locks guarantee the seal. This extends the life of paints, especially in Summer, hot climates, and under extreme conditions.

There will always be spare parts available for the components of the Wet Palette, and the correct size, ready to be used.

The top and bottom of the palette can be used as workable areas if so desired. The spare parts also fit on both parts.

The size of the Wet Palette is conceived to offer the largest possible working area while taking as little space as possible on the working desk. It is stable also when in motion.



Introduce the sponge in the palette and try to make sure it has a good amount of water left.

Soak the sponge with tap or distilled water, depending on which one you use.

Wet the wipe with water until it is completely saturated. And place it over the foam.



Moisten the paper with care. Place the paper centered over the wipe to cover it



Place the paints you are going to mix, considering the space you have.

Mix the paints at your needs, and when finished leave it in the fridge for further use.
